

## **Unpacking Reading Standard 9 Protocol**

## **Objectives:**

- 1. Understand the knowledge and skills required by Reading Standard 9 for literary and informational texts and what this means for your students.
- 2. Use the ANet objectives and question stems to write objectives and text-dependent questions aligned to Reading Standard 9.

- Schedule of Assessed Standards (SAS) to determine when Standard 9 is being assessed
- ANet Objectives Guide or Standards Tab on myANet
- Curriculum materials or pacing guide, including all texts for upcoming units

## Agenda:

Understand Reading Standard 9 for Informational or Literary Texts: Using the standard language and vertical progressions on myANet, determine the knowledge and skills required of students when they read linked passages and answer items aligned to Standard 9.

- What are the requirements of Reading Standard 9 at your grade level?
- How does this standard build on prior standards and prepare students for the next grade?
- 1. **Review Items and Question Stems on myANet**: Use the question stems and items aligned to Standard 9 on myANet to further understand how students may be assessed and strong questions that target these skills. (Note: The question stems and aligned items on myANet are examples of questions aligned to the standard.)
  - What do the sample items and question stems reveal students need to do when they are reading and answering questions about linked passages?
  - How can I use questions about linked passages to build students' knowledge and skill?
  - How does Reading Standard 9 build on the knowledge and skills embedded in other reading standards?
- 2. **Select Texts and Write Text-Dependent Questions**<sup>1</sup>: Look over your texts for the upcoming unit and determine two or three literary or informational texts to address Reading Standard

- 9. These texts should have a similar topic, theme, or author so they can be used to integrate information and to compare and contrast. Use the ANet objectives and question stems to write objectives and text-dependent questions aligned to the standard.
  - Which upcoming texts have similar topics or themes that can be used to teach
    Standard 9 and are sufficiently complex? (Use the Text Complexity Rubric for the appropriate genre.)
  - What objectives and text-dependent questions will you use with these texts? (Use the ANet Objectives.)
- 3. **Determine Next Steps:** Decide when you will follow up as a group to discuss how instruction worked and how you will adjust in the future to best support students.
  - When and how will I know if teaching Reading Standard 9 was successful?
  - How can we share our insights about teaching Reading Standard 9 as a group?
